

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:



Lent is nearly upon us! Rejoice? Or be scared? Yes, many people don't look forward to Lent. Childhood memories of giving up candy or sitting through weekly Stations of the Cross come immediately to mind. Words like "sacrifice," "discipline," and "self-denial" are often used in ways that suggest that Lent is something to be endured rather than a time of grace and spiritual growth. The somber purple seems to be overwhelming. Well, I love purple. I really enjoy Lent, because it is a reminder of the joyously glorious celebration of Easter to come. When we think about it, forty days isn't that terribly long.

Have you ever thought of Lent as a yearly second chance? Each year the Church gives us six weeks to take a long, loving look at our lives to see if our values and priorities are in line with God's desires for us. Since most of us realize that in one way or another we've wandered from God's path that He has traced for us, Lent becomes that second chance, a significant time, as Scripture reminds us, "to return to God with our whole heart."

This year here in our parish we will be offering several ways to make this return possible in our spiritual lives. Please consider being a part of some or even better, all these opportunities as we begin this solemn penitential season this coming Wednesday with the distribution of the blessed ashes.

- (1) **WEEKEND REFLECTIONS:** As some of you will recall, two years ago, during Lent I reflected in my Sunday homilies about the **"phantoms of the Passion,"** those biblical figures that appear during this important time in our salvation history and then inexplicably vanish. This year I have a new set of "phantoms" to share meditations with you, namely – *Malchus, Caiaphas, Pilate's Wife, Dismas, and Longinus*. Every week in this bulletin column I will share some thoughts on these five individuals and then expand the mediations during the weekend homilies. So, stay tuned!
- (2) **DAILY MASSES & CONFESSIONS:** Again, during Lent, we will be offering two daily masses – the usual morning mass at 8:30 am on Wednesdays through Saturdays. In addition, there will be evening mass on Tuesdays through Fridays at 6 pm. Our usual times for confessions will continue Wednesdays from 4-6 pm and Saturdays following the morning recitation of the Rosary and Mass.
- (3) **DEVOTIONS ON WEDNESDAYS:** I am pleased to announce that after last year's success, we will be having **Lent Devotions every Wednesday during Lent**. Starting at 1 pm, we will gather in the church to pray a different version of *The Way of the Cross* (Stations), followed by fellowship in the social hall. I will again be preparing a different homemade soup, followed by a reflection. This year's theme will be the biblical foundations of the Mass. Please refer to the insert in last week's bulletin for more details. Hope to see you there!
- (4) **SMALL FAITH GROUPS:** As I have been announcing in the past weeks at Mass, we are resurrecting the Small Faith Groups here at Saint Leo. This can be a wonderful opportunity to share our faith with fellow parishioners; but especially strengthen our spiritual lives by walking with others toward the Cross and Open Tomb this Easter. Details are in the bulletin, or you can stop Molly Fernan if you see her.
- (5) **FISH, FAITH, AND FELLOWSHIP:** I am equally glad that the Knights of Columbus have chosen to take up the mantle of our dormant fish dinners – not only in efforts to raise funds, but also for the opportunity to gather for a meal and be together. **Every Friday in Lent** the social hall will be open for this purpose. Please refer to the insert in last week's bulletin and tell your family and friends to join us! It starts this Friday. See you there!

My sisters and brothers in Christ, during this penitential, sacred, and beneficial season, the Lord and His Church invites all of us to deepen our faith and prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter morning. Through these moments listed above and any additional ways to become closer to Jesus, His Passion, Death, and Resurrection this Lent, may we discover the grace and strength to walk with Him again in His suffering, so that we may rejoice with the whole world this April in His glorious resurrection! ***Have a great Lent!***
