From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

The Sign of the Cross is probably the first prayer we are taught as children: ***In the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit.*** It's not just a pious hand gesture to start and end prayers. It's not just a sign that someone is Catholic, although that is a pretty good bet, but I've seen numerous non-Catholics use it. It is a reaffirmation of our Baptism! The Trinity is traced on our foreheads. The Trinity is called out when the holy water pours over our bodies, mostly our small infant bodies. The Trinity: The Father, our Creator – The Son, our Redeemer – The Spirit, our Sanctifier and Guide – become part of us!

Just think of what that means every time we trace our bodies with the Cross of Jesus Christ; when we mark ourselves with the love of God, the peace of Jesus and the communion of the Holy Spirit, whether we are dipping our fingers into a holy water font or ant anytime throughout our daily lives – our day to day journey of faith.



We touch our heads to be close to the Father – the One whose mere idea, whose smallest thought, created you and me out of boundless love. This is where we began, in the mind – in the hands, and in the very heart of God.

We touch our hearts to be close to the Son – the One whose unceasing love took Him to the Cross. Yes, He taught us how to love with hope, trust, forgiveness and mercy. His Sacred Heart is forever beating in tandem with every human heart through time and history – past, present, and future!

We touch our shoulders to be close to the Holy Spirit – the One who gives us strength, and who carries us on His shoulders — on His wings if you will – with His breathe of fiery hope – and who enables us to do God's good works here on earth and encourage ourselves and others to walk together again in our journey back to heaven.

When we make the Sign of the Cross and truly *pray* the Sign of the Cross, we make of ourselves an actual offering to God. You and I become real and powerful prayers! We have within ourselves the power of what the Most Holy Trinity truly is: **love united without separation.** Therefore, we must bring that love, that unity, that working together without separation into our daily, yes, even hourly (or minute by minute), lives. By doing this, whomever we meet, will be affected by and sanctified with the Trinitarian love of our true and eternal God – Three in One! Hence, we must do all good and holy things in the name of God – all that He is, all that He does, yes, we do it in the name of the Most Blessed Trinity.

Near the end of the Baptism ritual, there is a beautiful moment when the parents and godparents of the one being welcomed into the Church receive a lit candle from the flame of the Paschal (or Easter) Candle. The priest or deacon says to the one who has just received the outpouring of the Trinity's love in the saving waters, this: "Receive the light of Christ." On this Trinity Sunday, we can learn something about this awesome mystery from a fellow Christian, the Protestant preacher John Wesley, who once explained the Trinity in this way: "*The Trinity is three candles, giving off one light.*" Makes sense, right?

Let us pray to live in that same wonderful light! Yes, to always be drawn toward it, and to always have the strength to share it with others, especially those who may be shrouded in darkness, suffering in body, mind, and spirit, or feeling the coldness of isolation. May we join with all the lights of the Church (us the Mystical Body of Christ) – of the world – to move forward in unity and in love – with the beaming, guiding, and life-giving glow of the Holy Trinity: **IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND THE SON AND THE HOLY SPIRIT.**

And they all said: **AMEN!!**
