
A FAMILY PERSPECTIVE

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

In 1873 – the year before he officially established our parish here in Ridgway – the Third Bishop of Erie – The Right Reverend Tobias Mullen announced that the diocese would construct a new magnificent cathedral. Prior to this, Saint Patrick Church in Erie had served as the pro-cathedral until a suitable structure could be built. It took 20 years to get to the moment of announcing the building of the cathedral, quickly followed by the groundbreaking ceremony. How long did it take to complete this massive project? In the 1940s, after our church tragically burned, it took just over a year and half until our beautiful Saint Leo Church was complete. Not so in the late 19th Century for what would eventually become Saint Peter Cathedral. It took 20 years to finish the cathedral!

As the bishop realized – a cathedral just doesn't drop from the sky. You have to build it – stone by stone – pillar by pillar – person by person need to be part of the process. Bankers early on refused to give Bishop Mullen loans. They said the planned site for the cathedral was so far out of town that no one would ever worship there. They dubbed it "Mullen's Folly!" But the bishop was undeterred. He built trust with financiers. He built up support with the Catholic population of our diocese. He built on prayer and faith to make our Mother Church a reality. He built on the hope of Jesus Christ – that make the seemingly "impossible" possible – hope makes a so-called "folly" into a wonderfully made House of God.

Bishop Mullen refused to build until he had the funds and workers. When the money or craftsman's ran out. He waited. He prayed. He hoped until they could be replenished. When the government tried to levy taxes on the unfinished building siting that it wasn't really a church ye — Bishop Mullen said Mass and made holy the site, even when the cathedral yet had a roof! He built on hope and it paid off when our magnificent cathedral was dedicated in 1893.

During this Jubilee Year we need to be cognizant that hope must be built! Layer by layer – prayer by prayer – whisper by whisper from the heart of Jesus Christ to us. I found the following prayer from the Archdiocese of Dublin in Ireland. Building hope during this Holy Year is important to our witness of Jesus, not only this year, but every year!

BUILDING HOPE PRAYER

O God of Pilgrims, we give you thanks and praise. You constantly journey with us even in our darkness and doubts. We seek your way of loving kindness to walk together as one family. Open our eyes to recognize you in the faces of one another, in the breaking of bread and in the splendor of creation. May the risen Christ sow seeds of hope and new life deep within us. May our hearts and minds be filled with your Word, bringing forth truth, justice and peace. May the Holy Spirit working in and through us do much more than we can dare to imagine as we live out our baptismal calling in humble and loving service. We make this our prayer through Christ Our Lord. Amen.



By reciting this prayer often – we can, with an abundance of hope in our hearts and souls – build magnificent structures. Not just a cathedral – but a road to Heaven!

Always confident that the hope of Jesus Christ never disappoints, may He accompany and guide us this week and always!
