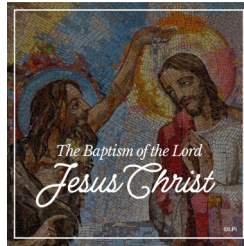

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments – January is Human Trafficking Prevention Month

In 2024, the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children received over 27,800 reports of possible child sex trafficking. The average age of child sex trafficking victims is 15 years old. Child sex trafficking is child abuse. It occurs when a minor is advertised, solicited, or exploited through a commercial sex act where sex is exchanged for money, food, shelter, drugs, or anything of value. Traffickers can be family members (even parents), friends, gangs, foster parents, trusted adults or boyfriends. Talk openly with your child about this reality and build resiliency. Address myths that glamorize the commercial sex industry. Warn about online risks: social media and gaming platforms are used by traffickers to target, groom, and recruit victims. Prepare your child: at some point they will likely encounter inappropriate messages or harmful content online. Teach them how to respond safely. Report suspected child sex trafficking by calling 1-800-843-5678 or visit CyberTipline.org. For additional resources visit www.eriercd.org/childprotection/

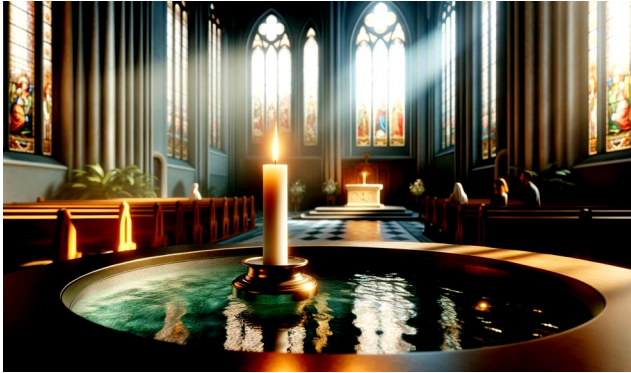

From the Pastor's Desk

My dear parish family:

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord, which officially and liturgically conclude our observance of Christmas. At the Vatican this weekend, Pope Leo will continue the custom as did his immediate predecessors, Popes Francis, Benedict XVI, and John Paul II, of baptizing the newly born children of Vatican employees. This celebration takes place in the magnificently adorned Sistine Chapel, where seven months ago, the Holy Father's election took place.

Pope Leo will bless that water in the baptismal font just as all priests and deacons do when they celebrate this most important and most sacred moment in a person's life. The Holy Father will pray the words either in Italian or Latin this weekend. This weekend as I bless water for the Sprinkling Rite at the start of masses, I will say the same words – but in English of course.



After the extended and beautiful prayer over the water at a Baptism, the minister physically touches the water and says this concluding phrase: *"We ask you Father, with your Son, to send your Holy Spirit upon the water of this font. May all who are buried with Christ in death, through baptism, rise also with him to newness of life. We ask this through Christ our Lord."*

Those final three words are pivotal: "newness of life." Yes, when we are washed in the saving waters of Baptism, our lives begin anew. True we were physically new when we were born – but now in Baptism there is a spiritual and lasting newness. We belong to Jesus Christ and His Church! We are new disciples that are beginning our journey of following the Lord – bearing Him witness – serving Him – sharing Him with others – and sacrificing for Him.

As this "new year" unfolds for through the weeks and months ahead, we must not be so caught up in the superficial or momentary things of this world – but hold fast to the truth that God "makes all things new."

A parishioner, on New Year's Day, asked if they might have a special blessing for the New Year. I did a quick search on my smart phone after Mass and I found this prayer. It covers all the bases I think, and I suggest we offer it now. 2026 is only two weeks old – but our journey of faith – our pilgrimage of hope – is once again new. Let us join with one another, walk with Jesus, always grateful to God for saving us at Baptism – making us new – offering us the promise of a new home – a new hope – a new life in Heaven that will last forever.

PRAYER FOR A BLESSING ON THE NEW YEAR

O sacred and adorable Trinity, hear our prayers on behalf of our holy Father the Pope, our Bishops, our clergy, and for all that are in authority over us. Bless, we beseech Thee, during the coming year, the whole Catholic Church; convert unbelievers; soften the hearts of sinners so that they may return to Thy friendship; give prosperity to our country and peace among the nations of the world; pour down Thy blessings upon our friends, relatives, and acquaintances, and upon our enemies, if we have any; assist the poor and the sick; have pity on the souls of those whom this year has taken from us; and do Thou be merciful to those who during the coming year will be summoned before Thy judgment seat. May all our actions be preceded by Thy inspirations and carried on by Thy assistance, so that all our prayers and works, having been begun in Thee, may likewise be ended through Thee. Amen.
