



From the Pastor's Desk

TU ES PETRUS (YOU ARE PETER): Recognizing the Bishops of Rome since 1846


II: Gioacchino Vincenzo Raffaele Luigi Pecci (POPE LEO XIII)

My dear parish family:

Within a few seconds of the one who is elected pope by secret ballot, they are asked two questions: first, if they accept their canonical election; and second, what papal name do they choose to be called. In the Conclave of 1878 – at the age of 67, Cardinal Pecci was elected and chose the name Leo XIII. He died in 1903. It has been 121 years since a Pope has been named Leo. Perhaps that will change? Only the Holy Spirit knows for sure. In the meantime, let's meet the Pope who led the Church through the doorway of the 19th into the 20th Century.

THE MAN -





HIS LIFE — Born: 2 March 1810 + Elected Pope: 20 February 1878 (age 67) + Died: 20 July 1903 (age 93) — He was the second-longest-reigning pope, after Pius IX, and also the longest-living pope. Although he continued to adhere to some of the traditional features of the papacy, he refused to completely reject the modern facets of the then-society. He mended diplomatic ties with Italy, Germany, and France, among others, by adopting a softer stance than his predecessors. He refused to merge Christianity with politics and also denounced Americanism. He was also a staunch follower of Thomas Aquinas. Though he did not agree with the views of liberal economists about the issue of labor exploitation, he believed that labor issues could be solved by mutual cooperation of business owners and their workers. His encyclicals showcase his belief in mediation as a path to solving social issues. He also wrote more on the Rosary than any pope before him.

<u>HIS WORDS</u> — "Thoughtful men and women, with hearts craving the truth, have come to seek in the Catholic Church the road which leads with surety to eternal life. They have understood that they could not cleave to Jesus Christ as the Head of the Church if they did not belong to the Body of Jesus Christ which is the Church. Nor could they ever hope to possess in all its purity the faith of Jesus Christ if they were to reject its legitimate teaching authority entrusted to Peter and his successors."

NEWS FROM ERIE — After Pope Leo died after 23 years as Bishop of Rome, The Right Reverend John Edmund Fitzmaurice, DD (1839 – 1920), who served as the Fourth Bishop of Erie from 1899 until 1920, issued a statement to the Diocese of Erie on Jul 21, 1903. In part, Bishop Mullen said: "The sad event has cast a gloom over the entire Catholic world. It has brought sorrow to Christians of every denomination, for the great heart of Leo went out in love to all men, and no one labored more earnestly than he for the unity of faith that's makes all brethren. The world at large owes him a deep debt of gratitude, but it is especially due to him by those of his own household of the faith."

POPE LEO XIII + pray for us – pray for our new Holy Father – pray for the entire Church!

Let us remember the Lord's words as we wait for our new Pope, "Remember you are Peter and upon this rock I will build My Church!"
